



# DRESS CODE

The intent of the dress code is to help establish an environment conducive to learning, one where clothing and physical appearance are a minimal distraction. Students are to be neatly attired and in dress code every day unless otherwise announced by the Head of Middle School.

## Uniform

- Shirts/Sweatshirts/Sweaters/Fleeces
  - Students may wear any Wellington-branded shirt/sweatshirt/sweater/fleece in navy blue, white or light gray.
  - All non-Wellington sweatshirts/hoodies/sweaters/fleece need to be solid-color in navy blue, white or light gray. T-shirts/polo shirts must be navy. Small non-Wellington clothing brand logos are permitted.
- Footwear
  - Footwear must be reasonably clean and in good repair.
  - Boots may not extend above the knee.
  - Shoes should grip feet and allow for easy movement. Shoes made primarily of plastic or rubber (i.e. Crocs, soccer slides, flip flops, etc.) are not permitted.
- Shorts
  - Tan or navy twill.
  - Cargo shorts, carpenter shorts and/or painter shorts are not permitted.
  - Shorts must be finger-tip in length.
- Skirts/Skorts
  - MacEwen plaid
    - Skirts must be finger- tip in length.

- Slacks

- Tan or navy twill
  - Cargo pants, carpenter pants, and/or painter pants are not permitted.
  - Jeggings/leggings are not permitted.

## Athletic Dress

Athletes are encouraged to promote home games and post-season tournament games by wearing their athletic uniform, team shirt, or dressy casual attire. All other aspects of our dress code apply.

## Non-Uniform

- Any graphics or messaging must be school appropriate.
- Leggings/jeggings can be worn under skirts or finger-tip length tops.

## General Policies (Uniform and Non-Uniform)

- Student clothing must fit properly.
- Tops must cover shoulders, collarbone, and midriff.
- Clothing must be free of rips and tears.
- Fishnet hose are not permitted.
- Leggings/jeggings can be worn under skirts.
- Hats are not permitted.
- Classes may require a specific shoe (e.g. science labs, physical education, etc.).
- School reserves the right to ask students to remove piercings and to cover tattoos at any time deemed necessary.
